STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Bible is God's Word to us.

The Bible was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs about living. Because it is inspired by God, it is truth without error. 2 Timothy 3:16, 1:13; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Psalm 119:105, 160, 12:6; Proverbs 30:5

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe.

He has eternally existed as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The three are coequal and are one God.

Jesus is the Son of God.

He is coequal with the Father and Holy Spirit. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven and will return again someday to earth to reign as King.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity.

The Holy Spirit is coequal with the Father and the Son of God. He is present in the world to make people aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He provides Christians with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. He gives every believer spiritual gifts when they are saved. As Christians we seek to live under His control daily.

We believe in the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

We believe that the church was empowered by the Holy Spirit in the book of Acts for the work of building the Kingdom of God. John 1:32-34; 20:22; Acts 2:1-4; 8:14-17; 19:6

We believe in the operation of the Gifts of the Spirit...

As enumerated in 1 Corinthians 1214, as manifested in the Early Church. The miraculous gifts (including speaking in tongues) produced by the Holy Spirit continue to function today just as they did when the Church was established.

We believe in the Spirit-filled life.

This is a life of separation from the world, and a life dedicated to God's work through the leading of the Holy Spirit. Ephesians 5:18; 2 Corinthians 6:14; 7:1

Salvation is God's free gift to us, but we must accept it.

We can never make up for our sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can anyone be saved from sin's penalty. When we turn from our self-ruled life and turn to Jesus in faith we are saved. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by faith.

Baptism is symbolic of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ.

Once we have accepted Jesus as our Lord and Savior, baptism is a way for us to publicly declare our new life in Christ. It is also a step of obedience based on God's commands and allows us to follow the example of Jesus, who submitted himself to baptism to "fulfill all righteousness."

The Lord's Supper is a unique time of communion

In the presence of God when the elements of bread and grape juice (the

Marriage is the covenant relationship between one man and one woman.

Marriage is defined in the Bible as a covenant, a sacred bond between one man and one woman, instituted by and publicly entered into before God. This union is intended to be a lifelong, exclusive relationship that mirrors the relationship between Christ and the Church. Same-sex relationships and marriages are seen as contrary to biblical teachings, as they do not align with the scriptural definition of marriage and are considered sinful.

Gender Identity

The Bible teaches that God created humanity in His image, making them male and female. This binary design is seen as a reflection of God's intentional and purposeful creation. The Bible emphasizes living in alignment with one's biological sex as part of honoring God's design. Any deviation from this design, such as transgenderism, is inconsistent with biblical teachings and the natural order established by God. Genesis 1:27; Deuteronomy 22:5

God's will for provision

It is the Father's will for believers to become whole, healthy, and successful in all areas of life. Because of the fall, many may not receive the full benefits of God's will while on Earth, but that fact should never prevent all believers from seeking the full benefits of Christ's provision in order to better serve others.

The local church is autonomous, that is, it is self-governing, selfsupporting and self-propagating in its mature state. Acts 2; 13:1-4

The biblical form of church government is a plurality of elders with a Lead Pastor who all qualify on the basis of 1Timothy 3 in spiritual life, character, domestic life and ruling ability.

Every believer in Christ must be subject to God's authority in a specific local church for spiritual protection and long term fruitfulness. Hebrews 13:17

The theological framework for understanding all of God's dealings with mankind is to be found in the divine covenants revealed in Scripture.

We believe in the public gathering of the Church together for prayer, worship, teaching and preaching of the Bible and the administering of the sacraments of the church.

In addition to essential beliefs, we have liberty in non-essential beliefs.
